## THE INVISIBLE WAR

#### Satan's Motives

 Satan wants to be in <u>control</u>. He wants us to follow his will, his plan, his path, to his destruction.

#### Satan's Methods

 Satan tempts us to sin by enticing us to meet our needs according to our <u>desires</u> instead of God's <u>design</u>.

#### **Our Defense**

 God gives us three sources of strength against temptation modelled by Jesus, <u>fasting</u>, <u>prayer</u>, and <u>scripture</u>.

#### Our Hope

 Our hope is in <u>receiving</u> the perfection of Jesus, not <u>attaining</u> our own perfection.

### **Further Study**

- 1. The temptation of Jesus takes place at the very start of His ministry. Satan often tempts us when we begin something new for God. Are there other Biblical or personal examples you have of this? How can we prepare for temptation when beginning a new work for God?
- 2. Satan's stops tempting Jesus and waits for an opportune time. All of Satan's temptations have an end point. How does this encourage us to stand firm against temptation? How does knowing this help us prepare for temptation?
- 3. Satan sought to deceive Jesus by defending his temptation with scripture. How does Satan seek to deceive you to sin?
