LAMENTING THE LOST

How can we emulate the heart of Jesus?

- 1) We weep over those who don't know Jesus.
 - <u>Evangelism</u> is spurred by our sorrow over the lost.

2) We weep over the **consequences** of sin.

Ezekiel 33:11 ... "Say to them, As I live, declares the Lord God, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from his way and live; turn back, turn back from your evil ways, for why will you die, O house of Israel?"

3) We stand firm in truth.

Sin cannot be conquered by <u>strength</u> only by <u>blood</u>.

Hebrews 9:22 ... "Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins."
