#### Surrendering to God's Will

#### What does it mean to surrender to God's will?

- Surrendering to God's will is a <u>process</u> by which we <u>deny</u> ourselves and <u>trust</u> God through <u>obedience</u>.
- Surrendering to God's will recognizes God has appointed us to our <u>time</u> and <u>circumstances</u> to accomplish specific <u>work</u>.
- There is nothing more <u>difficult</u> or <u>important</u> than surrendering to God's will.

Hebrews 4:15–16 ... "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need."

"What was the content of Jesus's 'prayers and supplications' in Hebrews 5:7?
