#### Three truths about our trials:

1) Our trials come in <u>various</u> forms.

Therefore, we need to <u>develop</u> a <u>resilient</u> spirit.

2) Our trials <u>remove</u> our <u>reliance</u> on the world.

Therefore, we need to <u>seek help</u> primarily from God.

3) Our trials open a path to a reward.

Therefore, we have reason to rejoice in our trials.

Matthew 5:11–12 ... ""Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you."
