

HONOR EVERYONE: HUSBANDS AND WIVES 1 PETER 3:1-7

Three truths for all of us:

- 1) If we don't <u>recognize</u> our own sin, we shouldn't correct others.
- 2) Our <u>heart</u> is more important than our <u>appearance</u>.
- 3) God's <u>salvation</u> is more important than <u>ourselves</u>.

For Husbands:

• Ask you wife, "What are three things I can do to honor or understand you better this week?"

For Wives:

• Ask you husband, "What are three things I can do to respect and submit to you better this week?"

Principles for the Discussion

- 1) Pray for humility and love.
- 2) Don't get defensive.
- 3) Listen to learn.
- 4) Ask questions to clarify.
- 5) Review the conversation with a wise friend or counselor.
- 6) Put into practice new ways to honor your spouse.
- 7) Don't get discouraged if they don't change, but honor your spouse for the sake of Christ.
