## What should we do to prepare for the end of all things?

1) Be <u>reasonable</u>, <u>calm</u> and <u>prayerful</u>.

Philippians 4:6–7 ... "do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

2) <u>Love</u> one another <u>eagerly</u>.

Colossians 3:12 ... "Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience,"

- 3) Welcome people warmly.
- 4) <u>Serve</u> the church <u>humbly</u>.
- 5) Glorify God wholeheartedly.
