

WHEN WE SUFFER WHAT SHOULD WE DO? 1 PETER 4:12-19

1) We expect trials to be a <u>normal</u> part of our lives. John 15:20 ... "Remember the word that I said to you: 'A servant is not greater than his master.' If they persecuted me, they will also persecute you. If they kept my word, they will also keep yours."

Truth: Our sufferings do not change who God is, they do reveal what we believe.

- 2) We expect to suffer for following God.
- 3) We look at our sufferings as <u>opportunities</u> to <u>grow</u> in our relationship with Jesus.

Matthew 5:10–12 ... "'Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. "Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you."

4) We respond to suffering with <u>faithfulness</u>.
