What should we look for in an elder or deacon?

1) Someone who is <u>faithful</u>, not <u>flawless</u>,

1 Corinthians 4:1–2 ... "This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful."

2) Someone who doesn't compromise <u>character</u> for success.

Matthew 23:27 ... ""Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs, which outwardly appear beautiful, but within are full of dead people's bones and all uncleanness."

- 3) Someone who is <u>humble</u> and <u>selfless</u>.
- 4) Someone who has a <u>relationship</u> with God worth <u>following</u>.
