

POLITY: THE ROLE OF ELDERS ACTS 20:17-38

1) Elders lead by setting the <u>example</u> of <u>serving</u> Christ. (Acts 20:19)

Matthew 20:25–28 ... "But Jesus called them to him and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. It shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be your slave, even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

- 2) Elders <u>proclaim</u> the gospel of Christ. (Acts 20:20-21)
- 3) Elders teach the whole council of God. (Acts 20:27)
- 4) Elders <u>defend</u> against <u>false</u> doctrine. (Acts 20:29-31)

Titus 1:9 ... "He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it."

5) Elders <u>love</u> the church. (Acts 20: 28, 36-38)

- 1) How do you view the role of pastor/elder in the church?
- 2) The role of pastor/elder in the church is described by Peter as a shepherd. How does the way I relate to pastors/elders reflect this role?
- 3) Though pastors and elders are shepherds, the chief shepherd is Jesus Christ. In what ways do people look at a pastor in the church as the chief shepherd? What are the dangers of this?
- 4) The church is a family with each member being adopted by God as His children and fellow heirs with Jesus Christ. In what ways does our view of church line up with this belief? In what ways does it differ?
