

PRAYER: AN ACT OF WORSHIP MATTHEW 6:9-13, ROMANS 12:1

Effective prayer begins with <u>worship</u> above our

<u>wants</u>.

Romans 12:1 ... "I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship."

What does it look like when prayer is an act of worship?

1) We <u>exalt</u> God above ourselves.

Luke 1:46 ... "And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord,"

- 2) We <u>submit</u> to His will.
- 3) We present our requests with faith.

- 2) Do my prayers focus on what I can get from God or giving myself to God?
- 3) How do we know we can trust God's will for our lives?
