Faith Like a Child

A welcoming attitude toward children

- 1) Children are <u>blessings</u> to be received, not <u>burdens</u> to be avoided.
- 2) We strive to <u>unite</u> generations within the church.

What does it mean to have faith like a child?

- 1) We recognize our utter dependence on God.
- 2) We freely receive God's gift of salvation.
- 3) We trust God with our lives.

Questions to Consider

- 1) Do I have a welcoming attitude toward children or do I tend to find them burdensome or a nuisance?
- 2) Am I connected with any children in the church? How can I help them be more fully integrated into the whole church body? (*Your own children and grandchildren count and are most important*)
- 3) When you look to God for salvation, do you come as a child with nothing to give and depend fully on Him?
- 4) Does your trust in God resemble that of a child or a skeptical adult?
