Key Scripture: Matthew 11:28-30

When we are overwhelmed by sin: (2 Cor. 5:21)

Jesus <u>takes</u> the load of our sin on Himself and <u>gives</u>

When we are overwhelmed by responsibilities: (Exodus 18:23)

 Not being able to do it all is not your <u>failure</u> it is God's <u>plan</u>.

When we are overwhelmed by activities: (Eph 5:15-17)

• God doesn't ask us to <u>accomplish</u> as much as we can, but to be faithful <u>stewards</u> of our time.

When we are overwhelmed with hurt: (Job 42:5-6)

• Our feeling of being overwhelmed is in direct relationship to our <u>view</u> of God.
