Key Scripture: Deuteronomy 4:1-14

#### How to think about the Old Testament Law:

- 1) The sacrifice of Jesus is <u>once</u> for <u>all</u>, all laws about sacrifices are fulfilled in Him.
- 2) All the Jewish <u>festivals</u> find their fulfillment in Jesus Christ.
- 3) The laws specific to the <u>nation</u> of Israel are not binding on the church as part of a <u>heavenly</u> kingdom.
- 4) The Holy Spirit guides us to <u>surpass</u> the letter of the law out of abundant <u>love</u>.

#### Three consequences of breaking God's law:

- 1) Just punishment.
- 2) Natural consequences.
- 3) Loving discipline.

### **Question 19**

Is there any way to escape punishment and be brought back into God's favor?

Yes, to satisfy his justice, God himself, out of mere mercy, reconciles us to himself and delivers us from sin and from the punishment for sin, by a Redeemer.
